# **OVERVIEW**

### NATIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING AND FINANCING LIMITED (NIFF) HAS BEEN APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNMENT TO FUND AND OVERSEE THE CYCLONE RECOVERY PROGRAMME.

#### North Island Weather Events (NIWE)

NIFF is assisting the Crown to provide financial support and project oversight to local councils in regions affected by the North Island Weather Events in January and February 2023. The goal of the NIWE response programme is to reduce intolerable risk to life, ensure insurability of residential properties in affected regions, and re-establish transport links. The NIWE response programme comprises these elements:

- Category 3 Buyouts cover the purchase of residential properties that meet the threshold for intolerable risk to life in Auckland, Hawkes Bay, Tairāwhiti, Masterton and Tauranga and where risk from future weather events cannot be mitigated. The Crown and councils are sharing the cost of these property buyouts 50-50. All property sales are voluntary.
- Category 2 Risk Mitigation projects look to implement community level or property level measures to reduce the risk of future weather events to Category 2 properties, which are residential properties that meet the threshold for intolerable risk to life where that risk can be mitigated. Councils are providing various levels of co-funding for these projects which include flood mitigation infrastructure such as stopbanks, improving drainage, upgrades to pump stations and lifting or relocating houses to higher ground.

 Regional Transport Projects cover repairs to slips, culverts, roads, bridges, and replacement of transport infrastructure affected by NIWE events.

#### Whenua Māori and Marae Pathways

The Crown is currently working with Marae and owners of whenua that is unsafe to occupy as a result of NIWE and has been categorised as Category 3. The Pathway involves the Crown working directly with Marae to provide relocation and rebuild support, and residents to provide relocation support, to ensure they are safe from future severe weather events.

#### **Nelson Severe Weather Event (NSWE)**

NIFF is assisting the Crown to provide financial support and programme oversight to Nelson City Council to reduce intolerable risk to life in affected areas via Category 3 Voluntary Buyouts and Category 2 Risk Mitigation Projects.

### Local Government Flood Resilience Co-investment Fund (LGFRCIF)

The Local Government Flood Resilience Co-investment Fund provides support to flood resilience projects of several regional and local councils. NIFF is overseeing the programme as part of its support of the cyclone recovery programme. All councils provide co-funding towards the projects.





# **CASE STUDY 1**

#### Impact of the 2023 North Island Weather **Events**

In January 2023, severe weather events had a profound effect on the Auckland road network. The region recorded more than 2,000 slips, along with significant damage to bridges, culverts, pavements, and footpaths. This widespread destruction disrupted access and required a large-scale recovery response by Auckland Transport.

The programme is led by the Auckland Transport (AT), and is supported by funding from the Crown, New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA) and Auckland Council.

#### **Auckland Transport's Flood Recovery** Response

Fixing these critical sites required a coordinated effort that involved not only immediate remedial works, but also longer-term planning for resilience. AT rapidly initiated

flood recovery efforts by deploying its established Road Asset Maintenance and Renewals contractors, including Downer, Fulton Hogan, Ventia, and Liveable Streets. In the initial months, over 500 personnel were mobilised daily to repair and restore access, focusing on reopening more than 150 closed roads. The strategic decision to utilise existing AT Road Asset Maintenance and Renewal Contracts facilitated a swift response, enabling the timely restoration of access to the roading network and accelerating complex reconstruction work.

#### **Progress on Repairs**

Following the severe weather events, issues at approximately 1,200 sites were promptly resolved in the subsequent months. In total, over 800 sites formed part of a longer recovery programme expected to take up to two years. Two and a half years since the event, AT has completed repairs to more than 734 (91%) of the 800 sites.



# **CASE STUDY 2**

# NGĀ MANGA ATAWHAI - NORTHLAND REGIONAL COUNCIL

Govt funding: \$2.07m | Co-funding: \$0.96m

**Total: \$3.03m** 

The Ngā Manga Atawhai project, funded under the Local Government Flood Resiliene Coinvestment Fund, was born from a partnership between Te Roroa Iwi, local councils, power companies, and other government agencies. Ngā Manga Atawhai leads land recovery and vegetation management in Te Tai Tokerau and beyond.

The funding for this project was awarded to Northland Regional Council, with the on-ground work being completed by Te Roroa Commercial Development.

#### **Part 1: Northland Regional Council**

Ngā Manga Atawhai has increased regional and national resilience by removing 1631 trees from in or near rivers, waterways, and floodplains. In some cases, these trees also threatened roading and electricity infrastructure.

This project will therefore make a large difference to flood resilience by reducing the trees that were already in

waterways, or would likely have impacted waterways, in a later severe weather event.

#### The scope of the project involves:

- Removing fallen and at-risk trees from river channels and flood plains, mitigating future flooding risk in the Northern Region.
- Tree crowns (tops) will be processed as Ramial Chipped Wood (RCW) – finely chipped and spread on landscape, improving soil porosity and ability to retain water, thus mitigating flooding via nature-based solutions, rather than hard infrastructure.



Ngā Manga Atawhai – Restoring Land, Rebuilding Community

#### **CASE STUDY Continued...**

#### Benefits of this work include:

- · Reduced impact to productive farmland
- Less lost time for farmers and landowners responding to downed trees in the future
- A shorter time for restoring farm production and local, regional, and national economy, including supply chains, in future severe weather events
- Reduced likelihood of downstream infrastructure (such as roads and bridges) being impacted in future severe weather events.

#### **Part 2: Te Roroa Commercial Development**

The funding for Northland Regional Council contributed toward the quick and effective response after the impact of the 2023 Cyclone Gabrielle weather events.

#### **Environmental benefits:**

By clearing blockages, fallen trees and invasive species, Ngā Manga helped improve water flow, reduce flood risk, and prevent erosion. In Waipoua and other areas, the work was followed up with weed control and replanting, helping give native species a fighting chance to recover.

#### Social benefits:

Ngā Manga's presence in the community and their visibility

in hi-vis jackets and work boots brought a peace of mind to landowners and whānau who were still feeling the effects of the cyclone. A lot of them said they felt relieved and grateful to see locals doing the work, people who know the whenua, and carry the cause with care.

#### **Economic benefits:**

This project created a pipeline of employment and training for people within the region. This contract gave Te Roroa the ability to grow their workforce, invest in equipment, and upskill their workers. The region now has a trained crew, a strong reputation for quality mahi, and the experience to take on bigger opportunities in the future.

### What the project has meant for people's lives – both the team and the wider community:

This work has been life-changing for the livelihood of the workers. Those who came into the project with no formal qualifications or prior training are now fully trained in areas including chainsaw use, Growsafe, tree felling, and environmental restoration.

For the wider community, it's shown that mana whenua-led responses work. Being able to do meaningful mahi for their own whenua, alongside their whanaunga, and being part of something bigger than just a job has created a sense of pride and ownership from working with aroha and a real connection to the area.

# **GLOSSARY**

#### **PROJECT DEFINITIONS:**

Approved: The project has been approved by Cyclone Recovery Unit (CRU) and the Ministers for funding to be released to Councils.

**Projects Commenced:** refers to projects that have commenced the construction or implementation phase. The project is now actively being built or put into action.

Procurement: The total value of procurement and supply contracts committed to by the Councils.

#### **PROPERTY CATEGORY DEFINITIONS:**

**Category 3:** properties affected by the NIWE or NSWE event where future severe weather event risk cannot be sufficiently mitigated. In some cases some current land use may remain acceptable, while for others there is an intolerable risk of injury or death.

**Category 2C:** properties affected by the NIWE or NSWE event where community level interventions are effective in managing future severe weather events risk.

**Category 2P:** properties affected by the NIWE or NSWE event where property level interventions are needed to manage future severe weather event risk, including in tandem with community level interventions.

#### **FUNDING DEFINITIONS:**

**Government Funding:** Financial support provided by the government to Councils to support Cyclone Recovery projects and initiatives

Co-Funding: Financial support provided by Council sources to fund Cyclone Recovery projects and initiatives.

**Government Funding Invested:** The value of financial support the Government has contributed and paid to Councils for Cyclone Recovery projects.

**Co-Funding Invested:** The value of financial support the Council has contributed and paid for Cyclone Recovery projects.
